The following questions were asked by potential bidders submitting letters of intent to bid, concerning the Joint Transportation Committee's (JTC) RFP for the study of Regulation of Transportation Network Companies (TNCs) in Washington State:

Q1. Will the same Workgroup be involved on both studies, or will there be separate Workgroups?

RESPONSE: If the same consultant is selected to conduct both studies (Taxi/ For-Hire and TNCs), the same Staff Workgroup may be used.

As for the stakeholder work, stakeholder consultation for each study will mostly be conducted separately. For each study, your study proposal should describe a plan for stakeholder consultation which needs to consider the most productive manner to engage stakeholders, whether individually or in groups. For the TNC study only, stakeholder engagement must include a strategy to try to resolve differences amongst stakeholders on policy recommendations to the Legislature.
